About the Artist

In a short period of time, the work of Russ Kramer has drawn a lot of attention. His unique vision creates 'first-hand' experiences for the viewer, putting you right on board during some of history's greatest yacht races. A sense of the dramatic moment, combined with meticulous research and attention to detail, have found considerable appeal.



Russ spent 20 years in journalism and advertising, but always knew he was born to be a marine artist. Finally, in 2002, he produced his first painting, which was exhibited in the prestigious Mystic International Marine Art Exhibition of that year. Since then, his work has been featured prominently at the Mystic Seaport Museum, and today his large-scale oils sell quickly into private and corporate collections.

Russ has been the subject of a one-man show at the Museum of Yachting in Newport, Rhode Island, appeared in *WoodenBoat*, *Yachting*, and *Sail* magazines, and in 2006 was elected a Fellow of the American Society of Marine Artists, its highest honor.

He is represented by the Maritime Gallery at Mystic Seaport and the J. Russell Jinishian Gallery in Fairfield, CT.
